Thanks to Rick Wolcott, Bill Wehrli, Russ Walker, Brett Davis, and Gene Day for leading trails this year; without whom, these monthly events could not happen.



Business Manager, Rex Holman went over what has been happening since the trail closures & a 45-day response period was opened for the Labyrinth Rims/Gemini Bridges area.

- ▶The donations that have come in via the Donation button put on the website in October at the time of this meeting were at \$8,000 as the website states, the Club will match any donations made up to another \$25,000 to the BRC. Regarding the MUD fund donation of \$25,000 sent to BRC to engage their lawyer to help fight the closure of the trails recently announced by the BLM we will also be sending the matching fund from our website.
- ► Utah's, Governor Cox is taking SUWA to task for overreach and Utah state has filed a lawsuit opposing the closures.
- •When it appears the Club is not overly concerned about these things – there are undercurrents going on that always bring results. We have never acted frantically to resolve issues like these – but we are very aware and working on them, you can always be assured of that!

Two new trails for 2024: •Lost World as scouted by Russ Walker – which is a spin off of part of the Crystal Geyser trail will run twice during Safari.

- •Crystal Geyser trail has been dropped for now from the Safari trail list because the Geyser has dried up.
- •Tommy Knocker will also be offered this next year it is an addition to the Jax Trax trail and runs 3 times in 2024 we still need a leader and several gunners on this trail if you are interested, contact Ron Brewer 435-259-7311 (rlbrewer@frontiernet.net).
- •The trails committee took Top of the World off the roster for the 2024 EJS. Both the back & front of the trail have become six vehicles wide. The trail has been destroyed by vehicles going to the side of the actual trail when they can't get up it. It is considered dangerous, and Safety always comes first.

The BRC advocates putting tracks down to keep trails open and literally wants you to drive on trails – if you want to do something to help keep trails open, get their book <u>Little Used Trails</u> and use the trails in it to keep them open. The iconic, Ber Knight, always said putting tracks down keeps trails open and that hasn't changed!

Mike Kelso wrote a reference letter in support of the Western Slope 4-Wheelers in Grand Junction's application for a grant to build an obstacle course for training 4x4 drivers in safety and knowledge of trail conditions on a 7-acre site. Good luck with your endeavors.

The Vendor portion of the RR4W website is up and running. It makes it easy to sign up for a vending booth during EJS!

Thanks to Russ Walker for the projector and movie screen. **Land Use**: Russ reported that the permits for the Price BLM for the trails in Emory County and the Forest Service Permits for Hotel Rock and the BLM Hole 'n the Rock and Hotel Rock have been applied for.
