



Red Rock 4-Wheelers Trail Supporter Program

The Red Rock 4 Wheelers (RR4W) are offering an opportunity for manufacturers, dealers, retailers, and other interested parties to support, in an exciting and proactive way, the club's Multiple Use Defense (MUD) fund. This fund is used in protecting Moab trails from legal and environmental challenges.

The Trail Supporter may choose one or more trails from the attached list and make the appropriate plans to market their product or service under the terms of the agreement outlined in this program.

Concept Idea: To allow organizations the opportunity to demonstrate support for organized four wheeling; to expose participants to their organization and products. A Trail Supporter is reserved two vehicle registration slots for the selected trail, and is strongly encouraged to make use of at least one. The Trail Supporter may provide, free to all trail participants, whatever item(s) the supporter chooses to serve as a memento of the occasion. Suggested items: baseball hats, antenna flags, key fobs, t-shirts, RR4W MUD pins or hats, gift coupons, etc. This is only limited by the Trail Supporter's imagination. Lunch or a small snack could even be considered.

What's In It for Me? Trail Supporters have a unique opportunity to demonstrate or show their product(s) and interact with a group that is highly motivated and is definitely interested in 4WD related items. By selecting the appropriate trail a Supporter can be with beginners, moderate, or experienced four wheelers. Attending the trip with the vendor's vehicle or a vehicle equipped with the Supporter's products provides a unique opportunity to allow interested 4 wheelers the opportunity to view the equipment in a real 4WD environment. The lunch stop offers an opportunity to invite viewing or questions about the product. Arranging for an optional stop at the conclusion of the trail can further enhance the contacts made with interested attendees.

Limitations: A Trail Supporter is encouraged to work closely with the Trail Leader and other officials. Supporters are encouraged to show up at least 30 minutes prior to the trail's scheduled departure time, and are allowed to interact freely with participants as long as the check in process of the trail officials is not disrupted. Trail departure, lunch, and other breaks must not be delayed or prolonged. Use of the C.B. radio for promotion is not allowed. Asking the Trail Leader to announce that the Supporter requests interested parties remain at the end point of the official trail is acceptable as long as a safe meeting place can be arranged. Supporters are allowed to display products or giveaway items during trail lineup, at lunch, or after the trail. Demonstration of a product is only allowed at the end of the trip unless it involves use of the Supporter's product in a legitimate way during the course of the trail as deemed acceptable by the Trail Leader (e.g. snatching or winching a stuck vehicle, etc.).

Trail Supporters are assured that their total trail donation will be directed to the RR4W MUD fund for trail preservation. Trail Supporters who sign up prior to the publishing deadline (**November 1st, 2017**) will receive recognition in the 2018 Jeep Safari Magazine on the appropriate trail description page(s). **You will also receive recognition in a special Moab Happenings Safari Edition in March of 2018.** **Trail Supporters who wish to keep the same trail in subsequent years must confirm their intention by October 1st, 2017 or trail(s) will be opened to next in line.**

Behind the Rocks, Cliff Hanger, Gold Bar Rim, Golden Spike, Moab Rim, Poison Spider & Pritchett Canyon.

One way use: Access only from designated "Entrance" Kane Creek Canyon, Hell's Revenge & Steel Bender.
